

Illinois Maternal Morbidity and Mortality Report

Links to County and National Data

On October 24, 2023, the Illinois Department of Public Health released Illinois' third [Maternal Morbidity and Mortality Report](#). The report provides state-level estimates for various indicators including chronic disease during pregnancy, severe maternal morbidity at delivery hospitalization and pregnancy-related deaths.

Maternal Morbidity at Delivery

Chronic Disease (Hypertension, Diabetes and Obesity) as indicated on the birth certificate (vital records).

Severe Maternal Morbidity (SMM) as indicated within the hospital discharge record for the delivery hospitalization and identified via ICD-10 codes.

Maternal Mortality

Pregnancy-Associated Death (the death of a woman during pregnancy or within one year of the end of a pregnancy from any cause) as identified by a variety of data sources as part of the states' Maternal Mortality Review Committees.

- **County:** *Not available*
- **National:** *Not available*

Pregnancy-Related Death (the death of a woman during pregnancy or within one year of the end of a pregnancy from a pregnancy complication, a chain of events initiated by pregnancy, or the aggravation of an unrelated condition by the physiologic effects of pregnancy) as identified by a variety of data sources and determined by to be pregnancy-related by the states' Maternal Mortality Review Committees.

- **County:** *Not available*
- **National:** The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's [ERASE MM Program](#) provides a centralized Mortality Review Information Application (MMRIA) data system which collects information from all states conducting Maternal Mortality Review Committee. Other Sources of Maternal Mortality Data

National Vital Statistics System (NVSS): <https://www.cdc.gov/nchs/data/hestat/maternal-mortality/2021/maternal-mortality-rates-2021.htm>

- ➔ Provides national data on maternal death (the death of a woman while pregnant or within 42 days of termination of pregnancy, irrespective of the duration and the site of the pregnancy, from any cause related to or aggravated by the pregnancy or its management, but not from accidental or incidental causes) as indicated on the death certificate (vital records).
- ➔ This is a different definition and data source from MMRC data, but is useful when comparing to other countries.

Pregnancy Mortality Surveillance System (PMSS):

- ➔ Provides national data on pregnancy-related deaths (all deaths while pregnant or within 1 year of the end of pregnancy from any cause related to or aggravated by the pregnancy) as determined by review conducted by medical epidemiologists.
- ➔ Less detailed information than MMRC data with regards to factors contributing to the death

- ➔ Provides state-level and county-level birth data by demographics and delivery characteristics as indicated from the birth certificate (vital records)

- ➔ Provides national, state and county level birth data by demographics and delivery characteristics as indicated on the birth certificate (vital records)
- ➔ Advanced query system allows for stratification

- ➔ Provides state and county-level data for the following indicators: low birth weight, preterm birth, prenatal care, breastfed during delivery hospitalization, smoking during pregnancy and teen birth rate
