IDPH Launches Enhanced Hospital Report Card

Website also includes updated Public Health Community Map with essential county-by-county health information

springfield – The Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) has launched a redesigned and enhanced Illinois Hospital Report Card website, with patient safety and quality of care information presented in a more user-friendly format. The same website, https://www.healthcarereportcard.illinois.gov, also includes an updated Illinois Public Health Community Map, with county-level information on health outcomes and access to care across Illinois.

Illinois Public Health Community Map Updates

- Data updates are scheduled in April and October
- Data has been updated through 2022 for April reporting
 - Except measures where data is not yet available
 - Early fall 2024 will be updated through 2023 for hospital discharge data
 - Some data sources not avail

Maternal and Infant Health Mapping Tool

Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA)

Overview

- Mapping tool focused on county-level data to help visualize factors affecting maternal and infant health
- Used for understanding the county's needs and for targeting resources
- Ability to download PDF report
- National resource
 - Provides county-level data only
 - Can be filtered by HRSA region or state
 - No comparison to state or national data

Additional Information Available

- NCHS urban-rural classification included with all reports
- Health Resources such as # hospitals with obstetric care and the family medicine provider rate
- Demographic Characteristics
- Geographic Areas

Data Details

- Most health indicator data are from 2017-2019, combined
 - In August 2024, data will be updated to 2020-2022 and many statewide rates will also be added
- Ability to upload your own data via ArcGIS Web Service or CSV file

County Health Rankings

University of Wisconsin, Population Health Institute

Overview

- Interactive tool which draws attention to why there are differences in health within and across communities
- Provides data on a wide range of factors known to impact health and equity
- National resource
 - Provides county, state and national data
 - Easy to compare your county to the state average as well as the national average
 - Also has a customizable comparator tool

Included information

For each county:

- Brief demographic summary
- Snapshot that includes
 - Health outcomes (length of life, quality of life, mortality)
 - Health factors (behaviors, clinical care, socio and economic, physical environment)

Data Details

- County profiles are updated annually with most current data available
 - 2024 profiles contain data from 2021-2022
- Provides trend data on select indicators

Maternal and Infant Health Indicators

- Low birthweight
- Infant mortality
- Teen births

County Profiles

I PROMOTE-IL, University of Illinois at Chicago

Overview

- Launched in September 2021 as part of the Maternal Health Innovation Program (I PROMOTE-IL) to increase access to data
- I PROMOTE-IL worked with partners to select relevant and reliable indicators
- Designed to be different from other resources in that all information for a particular county is available on one page

Data Details

- County profiles have been updated twice with the most current data available at the time of the update
 - V2 in June 2024 most indicators are from 2018-2022
 - A few more indicators will be added in August 2024
 - V1 in September 2021 most indicators are from 2015-2020
 - Data will no longer available once the V2 update is complete

Maternal and Infant Health Indicators

Includes many of the indicators available in other sources

Unique to this resource:

- Demographic information for women of reproductive age
- Overall birth rate
- Mental health, substance use and severe maternal morbidity at delivery
- Annual check up for women

Overlap between Resources

Many of the resources highlighted today include the same or very similar data.

Some were used to build others

County Level Reporting

Considerations

The ability to report data at the county-level is limited by small counts which affect anonymity and stability of the estimates

• This is especially true for rare events or for rural counties with low population

To be able to provide estimates:

- Several years of data may be combined (e.g. three-year average)
- The data may be smoothed or adjusted using statistical modeling to provide more stable estimates

Varies by Data Owners

Many organizations have data suppression rules which limit their ability to report data publicly

Data owners may also choose not to report on an indicator unless they can provide stable estimates for all counties in that jurisdiction
